Ikhala College Aliwal North, was honoured to receive guests from Neustadt and Cuxhaven FET Colleges, Germany. These Colleges are from the province Lower Saxony Germany, which is in partnership with FET Colleges in the Eastern Cape, South Africa.

Mrs. Sabine Meyer, Head of Department, Cuxhaven College, said this is the fourth year of the partnership which is mainly an exchange of teaching and training. This includes practical and theoretical courses.

Mrs. Meyer said their students hosted an African Dinner last year and decided to use the profit for the benefit of Ikhala College, Aliwal North. They bought bar equipment and special towels for polishing glasses to give as presents and also gave a grant to one student. The lucky level 3 hospitality student, Dimakatso Mandla, was very surprised when she received the grant, covering the cost of one semester's study fees. "We hope this grant will motivate her even more to excel and continue her studies" Mrs. Meyer said.

She also explained that the two colleges are very similar because both have a big emphasis on hospitality.

Cuxhaven College is situated in a coastal town. She said there is much to learn from each other in teaching methods and it is very interesting to see that we share the same challenges. She is very positive about the partnership and loves coming here. One of the extra benefits of this program is getting to know the people of the Eastern Cape.
